**What to EXPECT**  
2020 YMCA SUMMER PROGRAM



2 staff and up to 8 children per cohort

A cohort is a group of people.

- 1** Cohorts will include children of varying ages. Siblings will be placed within the same cohorts.
- 2** Cohorts will remain together each day/week, and will not mix or mingle with other groups.
- 3** Each cohort will have its own designated space and equipment.

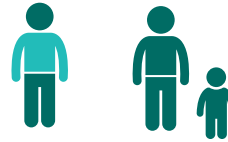
**ALL campers will complete a health screening at the start of each day**



Children must not have an elevated temperature.



Parents will be asked questions about their children's symptoms and exposure to potential cases.



Staff will meet families outside the program area to transfer care.

**Parents/guardians will not be allowed into the program space. Children that present symptoms of COVID-19 will not be able to join the camp program. Exceptions will be made for seasonal allergies and unrelated symptoms.**

 **Cleaning**



Our staff will **clean and disinfect frequently touched surfaces multiple times** throughout the day.



Shared equipment will be **disinfected between use by different cohorts.**



Shared spaces (e.g. washrooms) will be **disinfected between use by different cohorts.**



Children will be encouraged to **practice proper hand washing** and will be reminded to wash their hands before and after meals and throughout the day.

**Social Distancing and Personal Protective Equipment**

- 1** Children and staff within the same cohort are encouraged to maintain a distance of 2 meters from others when possible. Programming and activities will encourage physical distancing to minimize contact with one another.
- 2** Children and staff in different cohorts will not mix throughout the day or week and will maintain a distance of 2 meters at all times.
- 3** Staff will wear PPE (e.g. face masks) if approaching a child from outside of their cohort.
